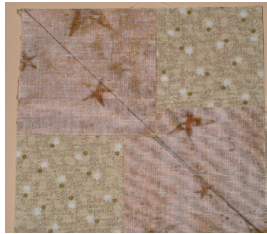
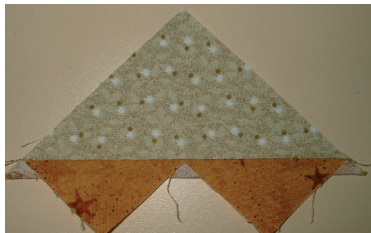




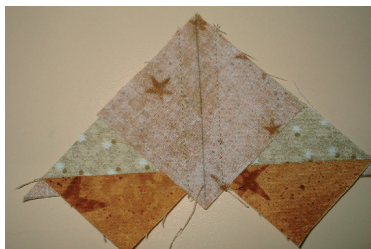
Easy Flying Geese Units.



Step 1.
Layer the smaller squares on opposite corners of your larger square. Draw a diagonal line across the back of the smaller squares. Stitch a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " either side of the line.



Step 2.
Cut apart on the drawn line and press towards the smaller triangles.



Step 3.
Place another smaller square on the corner as pictured. Draw another diagonal line on the back of this and stitch a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " either side of the line.



Step 4.
Cut apart on the drawn line. Press towards the smaller triangles as shown. The intersection where the smaller triangles cross should be $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the edge.



Step 5.
Trim off all the dog ears.

The Size Formula

(We are working with geese that have a width that is twice the height)

You will need one large square that is finished width + $\frac{1}{2}$ " (seam allowance) + $\frac{3}{4}$ "

Also four smaller squares that are finished height + $\frac{1}{2}$ " + $\frac{3}{8}$ "

These quantities will make four geese units.

As an example for a finished size of 3" x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " you need the following.

One square	$3" + \frac{1}{2}" + \frac{3}{4}" = 4\frac{1}{4}"$
Four Squares	$1\frac{1}{2}" + \frac{1}{2}" + \frac{3}{8}" = 2\frac{3}{8}"$
